Due to “in camera rule” and lack of statistics from Ireland, the outcomes quoted hereunder is taken from Canadian and USA trusted information.

The “trusted information” is from recognised academic institutions and individuals known as knowledgeable of PA / PAS. Although the best results is shown in this summary – the results are still very bad.

What is the result?

Parental alienation is the main cause of the outcomes. Eliminating PA will protect the child from a lot of hurt and make resources spent on the effects available for better use elsewhere.

The different columns are:

Outcome – **Other** PA – including working parents and other causes

Outcome – **Matrimonial** PA after divorce or separation

Outcome – **Institutional** PA – Foster care or care homes / orphanages

Outcome – **Institutional Non- PA** - Foster care or homes that actively prevented PA (adhering to at least the minimum access guidelines)
